Co-founder Chris Tomlinson re-iterated this and paid credit to the Munro Leys staff.

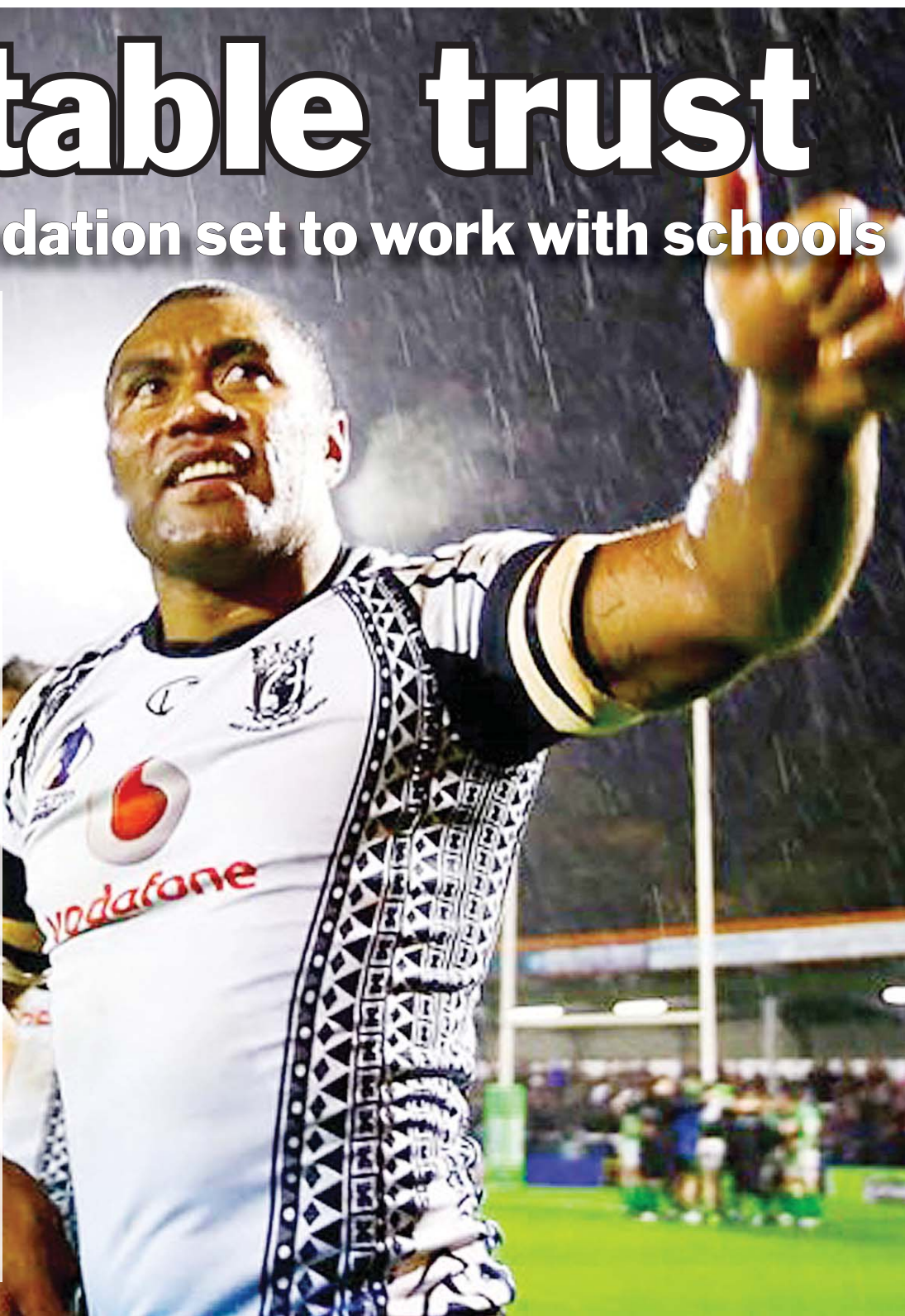
